

Grants Awarded in February 2015

Medical

Professor Michael Miles, London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine

Providing a Sir Halley Stewart Trust PhD scholarship and a contribution to the cost of supplementary reagents and subsistence in Bolivia and India, for the project *Point of care rapid diagnostic tests for neglected tropical diseases, with special reference to strongyloidiasis among vulnerable population.*

£54,000 over three years

Andean Medical Mission (AMM)

To fund a pterygia histopathology study in Bolivia, to provide a protocol for the urgency of treatment and explore simple strategies to prevent the growth of pterygia through education and social intervention.

£15,450 over 18 months

Dan Gore FRCOphth, Moorfields Eye Hospital

Towards the research study *Is cytomegalovirus (CMV) infection a cause of corneal graft rejection in the UK?*

£2,435 small grant

Social

The Dartington Hall Trust

A third and final year of funding towards the salary of the Dartington LandWorks Project Manager, for a pilot landscaping training project aiming to help the rehabilitation of offenders.

£25,000 over one year

Choices Islington

A third and final year of funding towards the 'I Am' project at HMP Holloway – a creative arts course to inspire and equip women upon their prison release to develop and maintain positive relationships free from coercion, violence and intimidation.

£25,000 over one year

University of Bristol, Glasgow Caledonian University and the University of Glasgow

To fund a four-month feasibility study into Football and Domestic Abuse in England and Scotland, involving the use of group consultations with relevant key stakeholders (from police and football association representatives, to specialist women's domestic violence services and abuse survivors).

£22,617.70 over four months

University of Stirling (on behalf of a consortium of the University of East Anglia, Queen's University Belfast, Cardiff University, the University of Edinburgh and University of Stirling)

Funding to develop a major funding proposal regarding a project to improve the lives of neglected children – specifically to establish a centre of excellence known as the UK Neglect Observatory.

Towards the launch of the UK Implementation Network in autumn 2014 – specifically a public launch event and two key learning events.
