Enabling the Ministry of Water and Environment (MoWE) of Yemen to independently manage its groundwater resources (water that flows and is stored within soil and rocks below the ground surface). Supporting them with creating a sustainable future of water supply working with people, technology, and data collection.

Supporting equitable access and improving experiences for trans and gender diverse people at end of life.

This programme uses floristry and skills training to address economic and emotional isolation in female survivors of human trafficking.

The Ready to Learn project aims to make a step-change in educational provision for two hard-to-reach, marginalized populations in Myanmar, Chin and Kachin. Both communities are off-grid, with little connectivity or electricity with very poor educational infrastructures.
